Commissioner James T. "Tim" Moore began his career with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) in 1973. Commissioner Moore quickly advanced through the professional ranks, becoming Director of the Division of Crime Laboratories and Staff Services in 1983 and appointed Deputy Commissioner just three years later.

As the State of Florida's top appointed law enforcement official, Commissioner Moore was tasked with the overall management responsibilities for FDLE, an agency of over 1,900 members and an annual budget exceeding \$260 million. Under Commissioner Moore's leadership, FDLE became the first statewide investigative agency in the country to be accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies.

As Executive Director of FDLE, Commissioner Moore was responsible for coordinating and directing domestic security efforts for the state. After the September 11th terrorist attack, Commissioner Moore led efforts to ensure Florida was prepared in case a similar attack occurred in Florida. Due to a tremendous amount of hard work in supporting the public safety mission of sheriffs, the Florida Sheriffs Association honored him as an Honorary Sheriff in 2003.
